Dance Awards give the candidate an opportunity to perform a series of dances choreographed by their Teacher. These build in length and complexity according to the Dance Award Level.

Guidelines

- 1. Where 2 or more routines are required, they can be of the same or mixed genres, but styles must not be mixed within a single dance
- 2. Candidates may enter into the Awards system at an appropriate Level of Achievement
- 3. The choice of music is at the Teacher's discretion
- 4. Props may be used in all Awards if desired
- 5. Skirts may be worn if this will enhance the dance, for example in National or Character dance styles
- 6. The Teacher must send the Examiner information via email how the set is being examined (see 'Entering Candidates' section below) prior to the session
- 7. Marks awarded:

Entering Candidates

SETS

1 - 6 candidates Nursery Dance Awards Primary - Level 4 Dance Awards 1 - 4 candidates

In a SET they perform either:

- a. The same dance at once and in unison (i.e. candidates cannot perform certain parts of a dance individually)
- b. The same dance but individually
- c. Different dances but in the same dance genre

Candidates must wear numbered badges to enable the Examiner to easily identify them.

All candidates entered as a SET will receive an individual report and mark, plus a badge and certificate.

GROUPS – 5 or more candidates performing the same group dance. It is the teacher's responsibility to arrange the timetable according to the Level and number of candidates in each group.

Candidates are not required to wear numbered badges for group Examinations.

All candidates entered as a GROUP will receive the same report and mark, plus a badge and certificate.
